1 5. Consistent with our standard practice and following instructions from Co-Lead
2 Counsel, I and other attorneys and staff working at my direction audited all of the billable time
3 entries, and deleted any entries in which descriptions were insufficiently detailed, tasks or en-
4 tries appeared duplicative, or if the specific task or amount of time billed was not reasonably
5 necessary to advance the litigation in the interest of consumers. In my professional opinion and
6 judgment, the entries appear to be reliable. In accordance with the Court's order, fee documen-
7 tation was submitted to Co-Lead Counsel on a monthly basis for their review and the final com-
8 piled fee documentation has been provided to Co-Lead Counsel for their additional audit and
9 review.

10 6. Attached as **Annex 2** is a summary of the hours contemporaneously recorded by
11 the billable Milberg Coleman Bryson Phillips Grossman, PLLC personnel who performed sig-
12 nificant work in the prosecution of this lawsuit. This summary identifies the total amount of
13 time devoted to each category of tasks by each billable professional using codes that are con-
14 sistent with those that have been used in recent class fee submissions in this Court and other
15 federal courts within the Ninth Circuit. The summary also identifies each professional's name,
16 title, hourly rate, and a calculation of the resulting fees. The hourly rates for each attorney and

Mr. Acciavatti is admitted to practice in courts in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania.



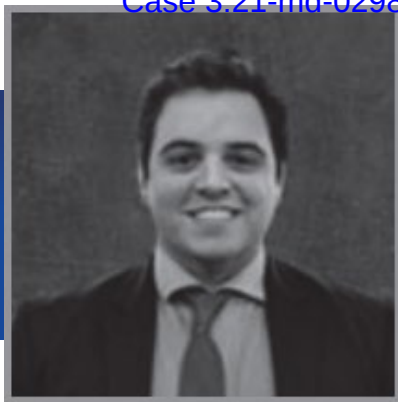

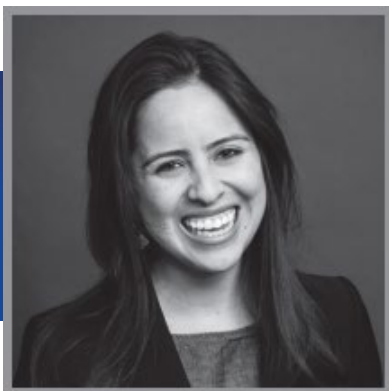
Blake Hunter Yagman
