DECLARATION OF ROCHELLE J. TEICHMILLER IN SUPPORT OF STATES' UNOPPOSED MOTION
FOR FINAL APPROVAL OF *PARENS PATRIAE* SETTLEMENT

1 I, Rochelle J. Teichmiller, declare and state as follows:

2 1. I am a Project Manager with A.B. Data, Ltd.’s Class Action Administration Division
3 (“A.B. Data”),¹ whose Corporate Office is located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. I am fully familiar with
4 the facts contained herein based upon my personal knowledge, and if called as a witness, could and
5 would testify competently thereto. I submit this Declaration at the request of Counsel for the Plaintiff
6 States to provide additional information regarding the notice efforts undertaken in connection with
7 the above-captioned action (the “Action”).

8 **DIRECT NOTICE**

9 2. Pursuant to the Court’s Order Re Notice of *Parens Patriae* Settlement (the “Notice
10 Approval Order,” ECF No. 616), A.B. Data was appointed by the Court to function as the Notice
11 Administrator for purposes of assisting the States in disseminating the Summary Notice and
12 providing electronic notice to Eligible Consumers.

13 3. On January 22, 2024, A.B. Data received from Google, via certified mail, a data set
14 containing 157,146,866 lines of data. A.B. Data performed a programmatic analysis of the data to
15 eliminate lines with faulty data (e.g., lines that contained only zeros), remove duplicate emails, and
16 eliminate records without email addresses. This process resulted in the identification of 122,700,426
17 unique emails.

18 4. Prior to emailing the approved Summary Notice to Eligible Consumers, A.B. Data
19 ran the 122,700,426 unique emails through a series of validation measures. First, A.B. Data submitted
20 the emails to a third-party validation service (“ZeroBounce”) to identify invalid and inactive email
21 addresses. This process is an industry standard with the purpose of identifying emails which are
22 confirmed to not exist or are unlikely to exist based on prior activity. It is critical to identify these
23 invalid and inactive email addresses as inbox providers will associate emails sent to these accounts
24 as a sign of spam, which may greatly affect the deliverability to otherwise valid recipients and the

1 overall success of the notice program. A total of 109,581,506 valid email addresses were identified
2 as a result of this initial process.

3 5. Furthermore, A.B. Data applied additional best practices recommended by its email
4 service provider and informed by A.B. Data's historical campaign data in other actions, including
5 the suppression of addresses previously confirmed as inactive and those that had unsubscribed from
6 receiving emails from A.B. Data. After these suppressions, the final Direct Notice List comprised
7 109,454,030 valid email addresses.

8 6. To maximize deliverability and minimize filtering, A.B. Data emailed the
9 Court-approved Summary Notice to those on the Direct Notice List between December 2, 2025, and
10 January 20, 2026, employing measures such as: (i) putting the Summary Notice in the body of the
11 email and eschewing attachments; (ii) avoiding words and phrases known to trigger spam filters; and
12 (iii) scheduling sends in tranches. In total, A.B. Data sent the Summary Notice to all 109,454,030
13 email addresses on the Direct Notice List. Of these, 106,164,867 emails were successfully delivered
14 and 3,289,163 were returned as undeliverable. Measured against the 122,700,426 unique email
15 records originally identified, this reflects an approximately eighty-six percent (86%) successful
16 delivery rate. Consistent with the Federal Judicial Center's *Judges' Class Action Notice and Claims*
17 *Process Checklist*, notice reaching approximately 70–95% of a given class is generally considered
18 reasonable. Here, the direct notice campaign's successful delivery rate is well within that range
19 without even accounting for the digital media publication campaign discussed in the next section. A
20 true and correct copy of the Summary Notice email is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

21 **DIGITAL MEDIA**

22 7. Beginning on December 2, 2025, A.B. Data caused digital banner ads and social
23 media newsfeed ads to appear on various websites and social media platforms for 45 days. Over 70
24 million impressions were delivered to potential Eligible Consumers.² When clicked, the banners
25 routed to the case website, www.GooglePlayStateAGAntitrustLitigation.com. The following digital

27 ² A digital impression refers to a single instance in which a piece of digital content—such as an advertisement,
28 social media post, or webpage—is displayed on a user's screen. It indicates that the content was rendered and
had the potential to be seen, regardless of whether the user actively engaged with it.

1 and social media networks were included in the campaign: (a) Facebook; (b) Google Display
2 Networks; (c) Google AdWords; (d) YouTube; and (e) Instagram. A sample of these digital banner
3 ads is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

4 **NEWS RELEASE**

5 8. On December 2, 2025, A.B. Data caused the Notice, formatted as a multimedia news
6 release (“MNR”), to be disseminated via PR Newswire’s US1 National Newline. This interactive
7 MNR was distributed to the news desks of approximately 14,500 newsrooms across the United
8 States, including general-market print, broadcast, and digital media outlets. Leveraging the
9 capabilities of a multimedia news release, the Notice included interactive elements such as embedded
10 images and hyperlinks, which enhance visibility and engagement by providing journalists and
11 audiences with multiple ways to access and share content. Across all platforms, including release
12 views, multimedia interactions, web crawler activity, and journalist engagement, the MNR generated
13 over 14,800 total views with more than 2,644 direct engagements. A sample of the MNR is attached
14 hereto as Exhibit C.

15 **SETTLEMENT WEBSITE**

16 9. On December 2, 2025, A.B. Data established a case-specific website,
17 www.GooglePlayStateAGAntitrustLitigation.com, to assist Eligible Consumers in understanding the
18 terms of the Settlement and their rights. The website provides, among other things, the Court-
19 approved long-form and summary notice, a summary of the case, related court documents, important
20 dates including the opt-out and objection deadline, a link to the online exclusion request form, and
21 the option to submit updated contact information. To date, A.B. Data has received 827,173 contact
22 information submissions through the website. The form to submit information is still active and
23 available on the website, which is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

24 **TELEPHONE HELPLINE**

25 10. On December 2, 2025, as part of notice administration in this matter, A.B. Data
26 established and continues to maintain the case-specific toll-free phone number, 866-905-8127. The
27 toll-free phone line provides callers with an automated interactive voice response system that assists
28 Eligible Consumers in understanding the terms of the Settlement and their rights. An automated

1 attendant answers all calls initially and presents callers with a series of choices to respond to basic
2 questions. To date, A.B. Data has received 1,662 calls to the helpline. If callers require further
3 assistance, they are instructed to send an email to the case specific email address,
4 info@GooglePlayStateAGAntitrustLitigation.com.

5 EMAIL

6 11. The case-specific email address was established for the sole purpose of enabling
7 Eligible Consumers and other interested parties to submit inquiries or communications pertaining to
8 the administration of this litigation. Upon receipt of an email, an automated response containing a
9 compilation of Frequently Asked Questions was issued. If the sender's inquiry was not resolved
10 through that initial communication, the sender was afforded the opportunity to reply, at which point
11 the correspondence was escalated and assigned to a live agent for individualized review and a
12 substantive response. To date, A.B. Data has received 3,402 emails. Three individuals sent emails
13 saying they wished to "object" to the Settlement. A.B. Data referred those individuals to the objection
14 procedures in the Notice. A.B. Data then passed those emails on to Counsel for the Plaintiff States.

15 EXCLUSIONS

16 12. The Summary Notice advised all Eligible Consumers that, in order to exclude
17 themselves from the Action, they were required to either: (a) complete and submit an opt-out form
18 through the designated online portal, or (b) send a written letter expressly stating their intention to
19 be excluded from the Action. All requests for exclusion were required to be submitted to A.B. Data
20 no later than February 19, 2026. By that date, 457 requests for exclusion were made, of which 451
21 were submitted via online portal and 6 were submitted via mail. A list identifying all Eligible
22 Consumers who submitted timely requests for exclusion is attached hereto as Exhibit D. The cities
23 next to the consumers' names on the list are where the consumers indicated they currently live and
24 include cities in Africa, Asia, Europe, and Canada.

25 ADMINISTRATION COSTS

26 13. As of the date of this Declaration, A.B. Data has billed a total of \$200,057.80 to this
27 matter. The administration costs reflect the work A.B. Data has performed in connection with notice
28 administration to date, which includes, among other things: administering the Notice Plan as

1 described in this Declaration including the costs of emailing the Summary Notice; implementing and
2 maintaining the dedicated toll-free number and email inbox for communications; designing and
3 maintaining the settlement website with the online exclusion form and contact information
4 submission capabilities; and time spent overseeing and managing the project.

5 14. A.B. Data estimates that the remaining administration fees and costs will be
6 approximately \$50,000, which is below A.B. Data's original estimate for this matter. Based on my
7 experience, the foregoing is a reasonable and realistic estimate of the fees and costs for the work
8 A.B. Data will continue to perform through the anticipated completion of the project, including
9 continuing to operate the contact information submission portal on the settlement website, the
10 dedicated phone line, and the email inbox. A.B. Data has circulated monthly invoices to Counsel for
11 the Plaintiff States to account for the work performed in connection with this matter.

Please read this Notice carefully. You are receiving this Notice because you may have paid for an app through the Google Play Store or paid for in-app content (including purchases in gaming apps, subscriptions, and ad-free versions of apps) through Google Play Billing between August 16, 2016, and September 30, 2023 (a "Qualifying Purchase"). For example, if you paid to download a game or made a purchase in an app downloaded from the Google Play Store, you may have **important rights** concerning the State Attorneys General lawsuit described below.

A proposed settlement has been reached in a consumer protection and antitrust lawsuit brought by the Attorneys General of all 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands ("State Attorneys General") against Google (the "Action").

The State Attorneys General claim that consumers paid too much to Google for apps and for purchases made in apps downloaded from the Google Play Store because Google monopolized app distribution on certain Android devices and in-app billing services. The State Attorneys General also claim that by monopolizing app distribution, Google reduced consumers' choices in apps. The State Attorneys General also claim that Google made misrepresentations to the public concerning

the risks of getting apps from sources other than the Google Play Store and Google's billing policies for apps. Google denies any wrongdoing and denies the allegations in the Complaint.

The State Attorneys General brought this lawsuit in their *parens patriae** capacity, on behalf of consumers who made Qualifying Purchases through Google Play Billing between August 16, 2016, and September 30, 2023, while living in any State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands.

As part of the settlement, a \$630 million Settlement Fund will be established. The Fund will be used to pay consumers who made at least one Qualifying Purchase, as well as the costs of administering the Fund and attorneys' fees. Your share of the Fund will be at least \$2 and may be more based on how much you paid for apps through the Google Play Store or for in-app content through Google Play Billing between August 16, 2016, and September 30, 2023, compared to the amount paid by all other consumers who made Qualifying Purchases.

You are receiving this Notice because Google's internal records show that you may have made a Qualifying Purchase using a Google payments profile with a "Legal Address" located in one of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands.

If the "Legal Address" listed in your Google payments profile at the time you made a Qualifying Purchase is in one of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands, then you are a member of this Action and you are eligible to receive a payment from the Settlement Fund.

If you are covered by this Action, **you may not have to do anything** to receive a payment from the Settlement Fund. The Settlement Fund will make the majority of payments automatically, and no claim form is necessary in most cases. Once the Settlement has been approved by the Court, you will receive an email from PayPal or a text from Venmo notifying you of your incoming payment at the email address or mobile phone number associated with your Google Play account. If that email address or phone number is also associated with a PayPal or Venmo account, then the payment will be made directly to that account. If that email address or phone number does not match an email address or phone number associated with a PayPal or Venmo account, then you have the option to create a new account or redirect the payment to a PayPal or Venmo account at another email address or phone number.

If you (a) do not have an existing PayPal or Venmo account and do not want to sign up for PayPal or Venmo, (b) no longer have access to the email address or

mobile phone number associated with your Google Play account, or (c) were expecting to receive a payment but did not, there will be a supplemental claims process after the automatic payments process is complete.

If you would like to be notified by email when the supplemental claims process starts, you may submit your name, email address, and mobile phone number at www.GooglePlayStateAGAntitrustLitigation.com.

By receiving money, you will give up any rights to sue, or continue to sue, Google separately over the claims at issue in this Action.

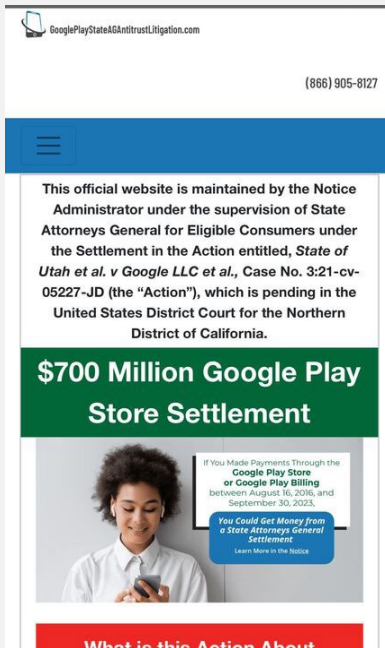

State Attorneys General Announce \$700 Million Settlement with Google over Play Store Misconduct

Google will pay \$630 million in restitution, minus costs and fees, to consumers who made purchases on the Google Play Store between August 2016 and September 2023 and were harmed by Google's anticompetitive practices. Google will pay the states an additional \$70 million for their sovereign claims. People eligible for restitution do not have to submit a claim – most will receive automatic payments through PayPal or Venmo. More details about that process will be forthcoming. The agreement also requires Google to make its business practices more procompetitive in a number of important ways.

The attorneys general sued Google in 2021 alleging that Google unlawfully monopolized the markets for Android app distribution and in-app payment processing. Specifically, the States claimed that Google signed anticompetitive contracts to prevent other app stores from being preloaded on Android devices, bought off key app developers who might have launched rival app stores, and created technological barriers to deter consumers from directly downloading apps to their devices.

The settlement requires Google to reform its business practices in the following ways:

1. Give all developers the ability to allow users to pay through in-app billing systems other than Google Play Billing for at least five years.
2. Allow developers to offer cheaper prices for their apps and in-app products for consumers who use alternative, non-Google billing systems for at least five years.
3. Permit developers to steer consumers toward alternative, non-Google billing systems by advertising cheaper prices within their apps themselves for at least five years.
4. Not enter contracts that require the Play Store to be the exclusive, pre-loaded app store on a device or home screen for at least five years.
5. Allow the installation of third-party apps on Android phones from outside the Google Play Store for at least seven years.
6. Revise and reduce the warnings that appear on an Android device if a user attempts to download a third-party app from outside the Google Play Store for at least five years.
7. Maintain Android system support for third-party app stores, including allowing automatic updates, for four years.
8. Not require developers to launch their app catalogs on the Play Store at the same time or with the same features as they launch on other app stores for at least four years.
9. Submit compliance reports to an independent monitor who will ensure that Google is not continuing its anticompetitive conduct for at least five years.

Generally, consumers are included if they paid for an app through the Google Play Store or paid for in-app content (including purchases in gaming apps, subscriptions, and ad-free versions of apps) through Google Play Billing between August 16, 2016, and September 30, 2023 ("Qualifying Purchases"), while living in any State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands.

As part of the settlement, a \$630 million Settlement Fund will be established. The Settlement Fund will be used to pay consumers who made at least one Qualifying Purchase and cover administration costs and attorneys' fees. Payments will be at least \$2 and may be more based on how much a consumer paid compared to the amount paid by all other consumers who made Qualifying Purchases. Additional details are in the Settlement Agreement and Release available on the website, www.GooglePlayStateAGAntitrustLitigation.com.

If consumers are covered by this Action, they **may not have to do anything** to receive a payment from the Settlement Fund. The Settlement Fund will make the majority of payments automatically, and no claim form is necessary in most cases. Once the Settlement has been approved by the Court, consumers will receive an email from PayPal or a text from Venmo notifying them of their incoming

payment at the email address or mobile phone number associated with their Google Play account. If that email address or phone number is also associated with a PayPal or Venmo account, then the payment will be made directly to that account. If that email address or phone number does not match an email address or phone number associated with a PayPal or Venmo account, then consumers have the option to create a new account or redirect the payment to a PayPal or Venmo account at another email address or phone number.

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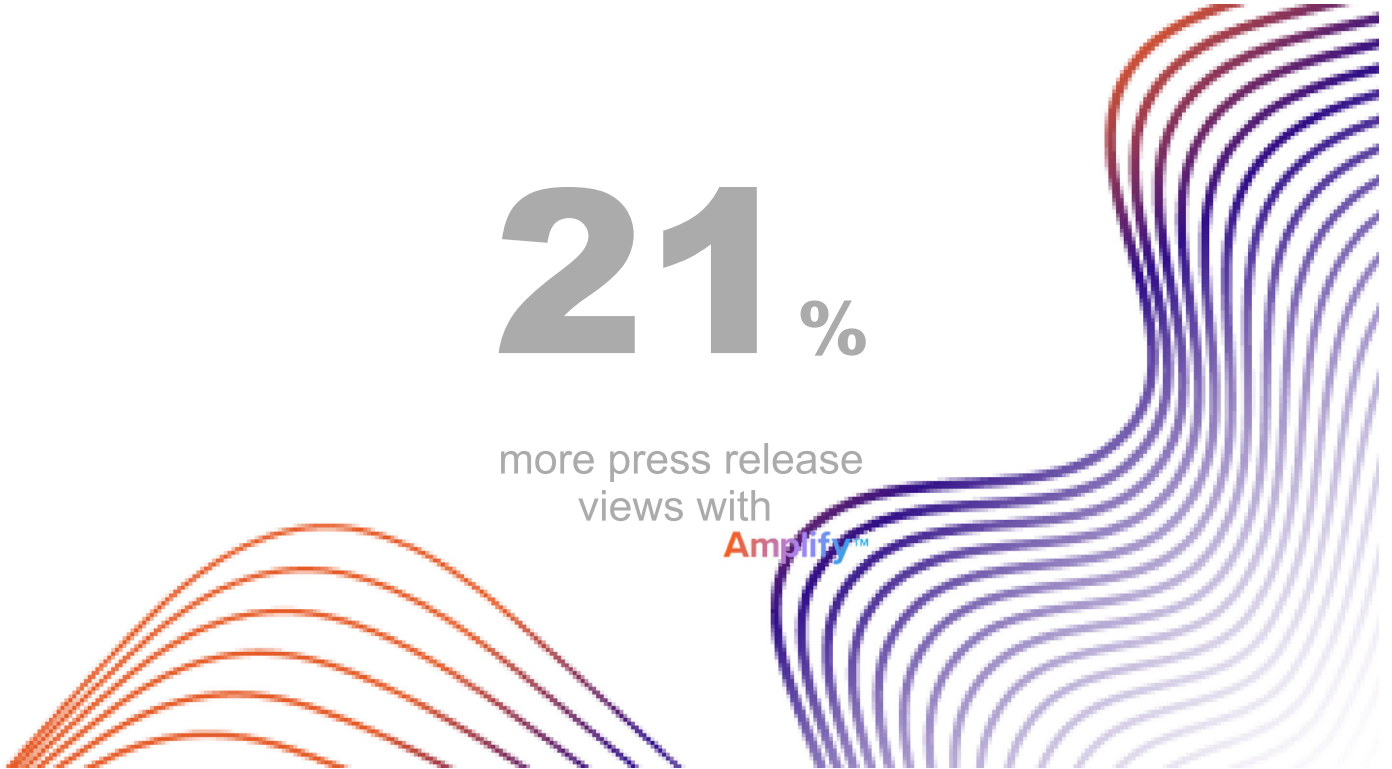
